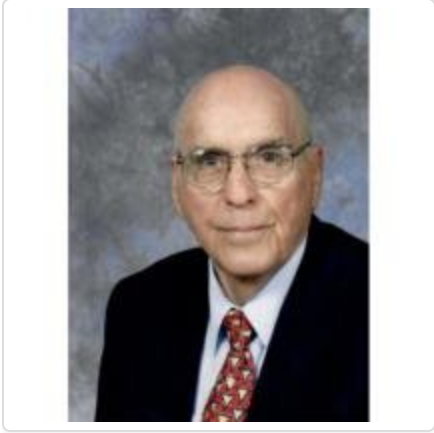




Clyde Austin

Mr. Clyde Austin, age 87, of Matthews, North Carolina, passed away Tuesday, November 7, 2017, at Pruitt Union Pointe in Monroe, NC.
