Michael B. "Bud" Hinson, Sr., went to live in the house not made with hands eternally in heaven on March 13, 2024.

Bud was born to Martin Ray Hinson and Ethel Bowers Hinson on June 20, 1952, and was proud to call Richfield, North Carolina, home.

Bud valued his relationships and was a devoted husband to his wife of 39 years, Hazeline Eudy Hinson, father to Michael B.
