Mickey Loyd Cauble, 80, passed away at home on Wednesday, April 8, 2026 at 4:30pm while surrounded by his family in prayer.

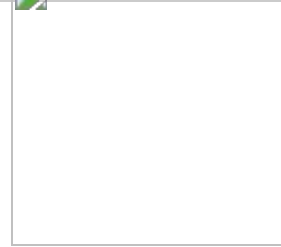
