William Scott Ollar passed from this life on November 20, 2022 surrounded by his loved ones. He was born on November 7, 1939, in Carterville , Illinois to Cecil and Pauline Ollar. He recently celebrated his 83rd birthday.

Bill (William) was a 1957 graduate of Carterville High School and attended Southern Illinois University on a music scholarship, securing the scholarship on his mastery of the trumpet. After college Bill moved to Memphis where he worked for Shroyer Engineering almost 20 years. At the age of 40 he and his brother Phil started their own business, Ollar Surveying Company. The business later also became a land development and reality company, Renaissance, with both areas serving the Memphis and neighboring Shelby and Fayette County regions. Bill served on the Board of Surveyor's for the State of Tennessee and used his expertise in the field to serve and educated others.

Bill loved music and enjoyed playing the trumpet throughout his life. He played at numerous events and played for a time with the Germantown Pop Symphony. He gave his life to Christ at the age of 33 and spent the rest of his life serving the Lord. He taught Sunday school for over 40 years and served the Church however he was needed. He had a true heart for helping others in anyway he could, financially or otherwise. He loved his country and served in the National Guard from which he was honorably discharged in October of

1970. In 1973, Bill married Charlotte Rush. They would have celebrated 50 years of marriage on February 15, 2023.
